ABOUT THE PLAY

MY GENIUS OF HUMANITY traces the journey of an Armenian-American family as they relocate from the United States to Armenia as part of the Armenian Repatriation Program conducted by the Stalin regime in the 1940s and 1950s.

WHO MAY AUDITION?

Auditions are open to all Fresno State students, and to community members. You do not need to be Armenian to audition.

WHAT SHOULD I PREPARE FOR AUDITIONS?

Preliminary Auditions: Actors will be asked to prepare a 1-2 minute monologue for preliminary auditions. Actors may then be asked to read a monologue or scene from the script. Callbacks: At the preliminary auditions, actors will be given a packet of callback scenes/monologues. Specific roles to prepare will be posted on the callback list.

HOW WILL I KNOW IF I AM CALLED BACK?

A callback list will be posted on the callboard by the Green Room in the Speech Arts Building. Actors may also be notified via email.

WHAT IS THE REHEARSAL AND PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE?

Rehearsals will be Sunday through Thursday evenings starting March 15th.

(There may be individual appointments for character/dialect work prior to the 15th).

There will be no rehearsals over Spring Break (March 29-April 3).

First tech rehearsal will be Sunday, April 26th, 1:00 p.m. call for actors; anticipated end is 11:00 p.m. Performances are May 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9 @ 8:00 p.m.; May 3 @ 2:00 p.m. (Actor call 1 hour before curtain).

WHAT ARE THE ROLES?

IVAN GRIGORIAN – Armenian; An officer representing the Soviet Ministry of Security

BORIS APKARIAN – Armenian; Ivan's all purpose lieutenant and aide-de-camp

SERGEI SIMONIAN – Armenian; Ivan's second all purpose lieutenant and aide-de-camp

NINA DAVIDIAN - a woman of striking bearing—late forties and older

DANIEL DAVIDIAN - Nina's husband, composed, fifty plus

ROSE DAVIDIAN - Nina and David's pretty daughter, 17 and older

ARMEN DAVIDIAN - Nina and David's sometimes callow son, 19 and older

MRS. KAPRELIAN – a pleasant and neighborly neighbor, 45 (in the U.S.)

JAKE AZARIAN – an American boy who owns a motorcycle, 27—Hollywood

ALEX AVAKIAN – a barber from Teaneck, 52

MRS. VARTANIAN – a loudmouth woman in her early seventies, she is often right

THE DUDEK PLAYER - A shadowy image. May be a live musician, or pantomimed to recorded music

All roles are challenging demanding full characterizations.

The role of Nina will be pre-cast; played by guest artist Jacqueline Antaramian (Fresno State Alum)

The role of Daniel will be precast

Nina's understudy will also be precast

All other roles will be cast from auditions

This is a very special opportunity for Fresno State actors to rehearse and perform with a professional New York actress with Broadway credits
