Shāhnāmeh or *The Book of Kings* is Iran's national epic. In its present form it was versified from a prose original in the 10th Century A.D. by Iran's national poet, Ferdowsi. *Shāhnāmeh* is the ethnic history of the Iranians the way they have imagined it over their long history. Its narrative has profoundly affected the development of Iranian nationalism and identity for a thousand years. Dr. Omidsalar's lecture explores the tension between Iran and the West in the context of the *Shāhnāmeh* and considers the cultural and political implications of the epic with respect to the role that Iran demands for herself in the regional and international arenas.
